| DP044 | 1936-1937 | Brevard College Stone Fence and Gate | Constructed by the Wright brother, Fred Mills and students from Brevard College under the Work Progress Administration | |
| DP045 | 1946 | Dunn's Rock School AKA Connestee School | | MJM |
| DP046 | 1898 | Biltmore Forest School | Forestry school built by Dr. Carl A. Achenck; Located at current Cradle of Forestry on US 276 in the Pisgah National Forest | |
| DP047 | ca. 1930's | Lodge at Gwynn Valley Camp (AKA Gay Valley Camp) | Island Ford Road. Established as Connestee Cove Camp in 1923. Adirondack style is sheathed with unpeeled log slabs. | |
| DP048 | 1940's | Camp Transylvania. Became Transylvania Music Camp | Note tents. William C. Austin, Photographer | Austin |
| DP049 | ca. 1950's | Albert Schweitzer Memorial Hospital (rear) | Balsam Grove. Only hospital in the US named after Albert Schweitzer. | |
