

Information for our Wi-fi users

- Use of the Library's WiFi service is your agreement with the terms and conditions of the Library's Wireless Internet Access.
- As a customer of the Library, your ability to post or link to copyrighted material is governed by United States copyright law. In accordance with 17 USC S 512 (i)(1)(A), the Library may terminate a patron's access to the system or network for disrespect or violation of the intellectual property rights of others, or for repeat infringements of copyright. Wireless users who do not follow the rules for wireless Internet use may be asked to stop using the Library's wireless connection, be excluded from the Library, and/or be prosecuted. Unauthorized downloading of copyrighted material(s) is strictly forbidden and will result in suspension or revocation of Library privileges and may result in a formal notification to the appropriate local law enforcement office.
- The Library utilizes a security appliance for the wireless connection. Use of the wireless connection is covered by the Library's Computer and Internet Use Policy. Copies of this policy are on the Library website and are available at all service desks. By using this connection, user acknowledge that security errors and hacking are an inherent risk associated with any wireless service. For that reason, users expressly agree that they knowingly assume such risk, and further agree to hold the Library harmless from any claim of loss arising out of, or related to, any such instance of hacking or other unauthorized use or access into the patron's computer.
- Communication over a wireless network is not secure. The Library assumes no responsibility for the safety of your equipment or data while using the wireless network. The Library highly recommends that all laptops or wireless devices have up-to-date anti-virus software, spyware protection, and a personal firewall installed while utilizing the Library's wireless network.
- Available power outlets may be used wherever the cord does not present a tripping hazard or block access for patrons or staff. Chairs or tables are not to be moved to electrical outlets. It is recommended that you charge your battery before coming to the Library.
- Accessing Internet sites and computer applications with sound requires the use of headphones.
