### Dear Community,

When people ask me how things are going at the library, one of my common replies is "Great! Busy!" It is true, and you can see that just by looking at all the activities on the calendar. However, since we just wrapped up our annual reporting to the State Library of NC, I thought it would be helpful to share some numbers. From July 2022 to June 2023:

- You all borrowed library materials 349,612 times! That's an average of 10.5 items per County resident. Of those, 73,949, or 21%, were digital checkouts (ebooks, e-audiobooks, etc.) 121,151 checkouts were children's materials.
- You visited the library 150,632 times! We watched daily counts rise steadily throughout the year as folks became more comfortable in public spaces again. In July and August of 2023, we reached approximately 550 visitors a day on average—comparable to rates before the pandemic.

- Your program attendance totaled 19,823! This was the second highest annual total in at least 20 years.
- You asked 13,105 tough questions! These were research inquiries, technology assistance and other in-depth information needs resulting in reference consultations.

It is too early to see comparisons for this year, but we are typically among the top in the state for an average resident's use of the library. In the prior year, of the 71 county and regional library systems in NC, you ranked per capita: #1 for checkouts, #2 for library visits and checkouts of children's materials, #4 for digital checkouts and #5 for program attendance.

So, I may say that the library is busy, but that is really a reflection of you - the enthusiastic readers and learners. We wouldn't want it any other way!


