



I'm not sure how it happens, but summer always sneaks up on me. All of a sudden, we are welcoming back our seasonal neighbors, students who are too busy to come around as often during the school year, and folks getting armloads of books to take with them to the beach or other vacation spots. It is the library's busiest time of year, by far. Nearly half of our annual program attendance occurs during the three-month span of June through August. Checkouts spike. Upwards of 550 people will come through our doors daily, on average. Our calendars are packed. It is very exciting!
