Dear Community,

If you are reading this, you know that the library offers a vast array of programs and services to everyone in the Transylvania Community. You might not know that we also offer several specialized programs that we do not advertise. For example, youth services staff regularly visit preschools to read stories and offer early literacy lessons.

I want to spotlight one of these "secret" programs today: the Round Table. It may seem odd that I'm promoting a program that I'm not encouraging you to attend, but I think it is a valuable peek behind the scenes, not just of the library, but of our community.

Around four years ago, the United Way of Transylvania County disbanded. In addition to funding local organizations, UWTC was a hub of engagement for local nonprofits. As transition plans developed, the library stepped in to help maintain and grow those connections by taking over one of its programs: the Round Table.

Each month, representatives from local and regional health and human service nonprofit and government agencies gather at the library. They identify common goals, opportunities for collaboration and support, and share needs and challenges. Round Table members work with every area of need: housing and homelessness, childcare, food insecurity, reentry from incarceration, aging, resources for individuals with disabilities, mental health — and more. While most attend in person, it is a hybrid meeting, and those who cannot get to the library join virtually.

At a time when many things seem divided, that is not the case among the people with their feet on the ground locally, doing the hard work to tackle these complex and challenging issues. While many local organizations would benefit from more financial resources, there is no shortage of kindness, compassion, and persistence among this group of individuals doing vital work throughout Transylvania County.


