This is a good time of year to reflect with gratitude. The Transylvania County Library is a wonderful library, and that is possible because of our strong, supportive community. There are some folks I want to recognize for their exemplary contributions to the library.

David Watkins was appointed to the Library Board of Trustees in March 1993, and has continuously served in leadership roles on Library Boards since. For over thirty years, he has been a steadfast advocate for the library, helping shape the community's vision of what a library can be and wrangling funds and support to realize that vision. He understood that a library was more than a building – it could be a point of community pride, a source of hope, an opportunity to learn, gather and grow together. He also understood that a really nice building helps, and was a leader in the capital campaign that raised the funds for our current building. Our Library would not be what it is today without David Watkins. This summer, David "retired." He stepped down as chair of the Library Foundation and switched to an honorary emeritus role. In December, David will be awarded a Library Advocate of the Year award by the NC Public Library Directors Association. David, congratulations and thank you!

I also want to thank the incredible crew of Friends of the Library volunteers who give their time to sell books to raise funds for library programs, both at the Second Story Book Store and at the annual sale. Unfortunately, due to Helene, we had to make the difficult decision to cancel this year's sale. You may not know, but the dates for the annual book sale are set nearly a year in advance to secure time in the busy Rogow Room. Before the sale opens to the public, there is an intensive week of set-up requiring several dozen volunteers. Set-up for this year's sale was scheduled to begin Saturday, September 28 (the day after the storm hit) and continue the following week (when the library was closed and access was unavailable). It was impossible to proceed as planned, and due to the busy room schedule and challenges with other logistics, rescheduling was not an option. Thank you to the volunteers who planned to work this sale. Fortunately, the Friends' Board is confident in its ability to support Library programs and services in the coming year. You can support their efforts by shopping at the book store (many of the books for the annual sale were moved there) or donating to the Friends.

## tuesday, dec. 10 • noon be joyful! musicke antiqua










The Book Store is open Monday - Friday from 9:30 am - 4:00 pm. It will be closed Dec. 23 - Jan. 1.




