### Dear Community,

The library is always growing and evolving to reflect the needs of the people we serve. As our community changes, we listen, adapt, and expand our collections to ensure that everyone can find materials that are engaging, useful and relevant to their lives. I'm excited to highlight two new collections designed to improve access and better meet the needs of our readers.

First, we've expanded and relocated our **Spanish-language** materials for adults. While we already had a small selection scattered throughout our general adult collection, we've now gathered them into a dedicated section and added new titles. This collection, located by the first floor elevator, includes fiction and nonfiction books for Spanish-speaking community members and those learning or reading in Spanish. By creating this space, we hope to make these materials easier to find and more inviting for all.

We're also introducing **Wonderbooks** to our children's collection. Wonderbooks are print books with a built-in audio player that allows kids to listen as they read along. These interactive books support literacy development, making reading more accessible for emerging and reluctant readers. Whether a child is building confidence in their reading skills or simply enjoying a story in a new way, they provide a fun and engaging experience. As I write this, we're eagerly awaiting our first shipment, so keep an eye out for them to hit the shelves soon!

The library is a place where everyone can discover something that speaks to them—literally, in the case of Wonderbooks! Expanding our collections in meaningful ways ensures that all members of our community can find library materials that reflect their interests, experiences and needs.

We invite you to explore these new collections, share them with others, and let us know how we can continue to improve.


